BEACON.—Brother Joseph Maria Yack, retired Jesuit of the Society of Mary, died here on June 12 at Villa St. Joseph, Marianist Preparatory. He was in his eighty-second year. Brother Yack came from a Rochester family which gave three members to religious life whose combined service totaled 100 years. He himself was a Marianist 54 years. His elder brother, Brother James Yack, at the time of his death in 1937 at Minerva, N. Y., had completed 47 years in the same society. His sister, known in religion as Sister Rubella, is now in her

85th year as a nun in the College of Notre Dame of Maryland in Baltimore. Born in 1861, Brother Yack as a boy attended his parish school of St. Peter and Paul's, Rochester, then conducted by the Marianists. At the age of twelve he made known his desire to join the Brothers and went to the postulate in Dayton, O. He was one of twenty who in April, 1878, made their first profession of religious poverty, chastity and obedience. During the past three years Brother Yack lived in retirement at Marianist Preparatory, here.

Parish services were held for the late and dear brother on June 12, when he was interred in the Marianist cemetery on the grounds of the University of Dayton.
