**HOLY SEE SENDS FOOD TO BRITISH WAR PRISONERS**

LONDON.—(NC)—The Holy See is helping to feed British prisoners of war held by the Japanese in Hong Kong and Singapore. It was reported in the House of Commons by the Foreign Secretary, answering a question.
