

2 Schools Here In Radio Broadcast To Latin America

Two programs of music originating in Catholic high schools of Rochester will be broadcast by short-wave to Latin America on July 2 and July 9, in the series known as "Programas de la Juventud Catolica."

The local participating units are Nazareth Academy, which will broadcast on July 2, and Mercy High School, whose program will be released on July 9.

The Nazareth Academy program will present the Peruvian Choir under the direction of Sister M. Irmina, the academy orchestra directed by Kenneth Waide, the Chorus Speech group directed by Sister M. Clarissa, and more than two hundred members of the senior class singing under the direction

of the Rev. Benedict Ekmann, professor of Sacred Music at St. Bernard's Seminary. General arrangements of the program were made by Sister M. Florentina.

Participating in the program sponsored by Our Lady of Mercy High School will be the students' chorus and orchestra. The program was arranged by Sister Mary Margaret and Sister Mary Francesca, Principals.

The Mission Crusade radio programs originated in a resolution adopted by the 1941 national convention of the organization, which was held in Rochester, with the Rev. John E. Handak, diocesan director, as local manager.

The purpose of the project is to promote good will between youth groups of the American republics by making known to the young people of Central and South America some of the religious and cultural activities of students in the U. S. A. An earlier program in the series was sponsored by Aquinas Institute of this city.

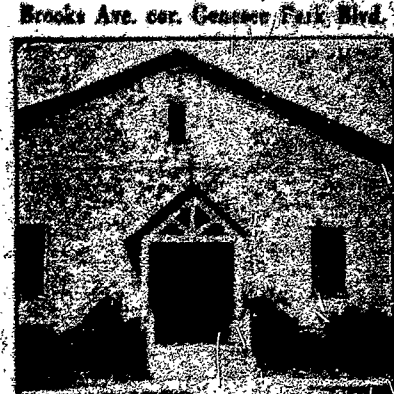
