Father Walz To Enter Passionist Order

The Rev. Frederick L. Walz, recently serving as Administrator of St. Joseph's Church, Weedsport, has decided to enter the community of the Passionist Fathers at Galena, Kans.

Son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Walz of 902 North St., Rochester who have been blessed with 12 children, Father Walz was accorded a farewell by the family on Sunday evening, June 14.

As a boy, the future priest was first instructed by the School Sisters of Notre Dame at Holy Redeemer School. Heeding his vocation, the young man first spent three years at St. Mary's Seminary in Burkettsville, Ohio, conducted by the Precious Blood Fathers. Ill health caused him to return home.

He then began his studies at St. Andrew's Seminary and continued at St. Bernard's Seminary and was ordained to the Holy Priesthood on June 9, 1933.

First assignment was as assistant pastor to the late Msgr. John P. Sheffhorn at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church. Later he was appointed as assistant pastor of St. Boniface Church. About a year ago he was transferred to St. Mary's Church, Dansville, and later was named by Bishop Kearney as administrator of St. Joseph's Church, Weedsport.

Father Walz' mother and father, brothers and sisters, and relatives and friends joined this week in paying tribute to his sacerdotal service and in wishing him many blessed years in the religious life of the Passionist Fathers.
