Sounds War Workers Call

VEND War Industries training Director Verne A. Bird, announced today the immediate need for 8,000 men and women as skilled workers in war plants. He said, "Now is the time to sign for a role in the battle of production."

He also stated that hundreds of men and women in the Western New York area must be prepared into service in industry before this war is over, but who first must be trained.

Demands of the war plants for approximately 8,000 war workers in Rochester immediately will

mean that employable from all walks of life must be trained in the Vocational Education for National Defense Program which is now running continuously 24 hours a day at seven Rochester High Schools.

Mr. Bird also issued another appeal urging all non-war workers to take at least part time training in order to be fitted for a position in a war industry when and if a serious labor shortage makes drafting of war workers a necessity.

Recruiting of potential war workers from the rural areas is

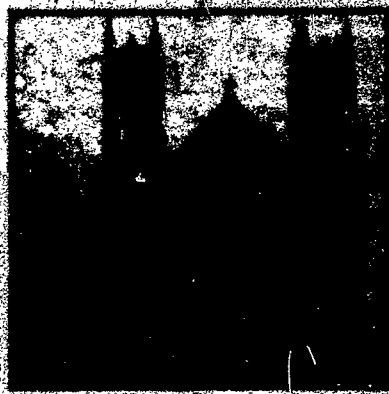
