

#### Fr. Newcomb Gives Address At Graduation Exercises

CORNING The Rev John C Mary's Church, was the speaker at the graduation exercises of St. Vincent de Paul's School on Friday evening, June 19, in the Church. Father Newcomb addressing the graduates said in part
"It will be well for you, to recall

all the eacrifices that have been made in order that you might have Christ with you. There has been an enormous excrisice of expense on the part of your parents in send-ing you to a passochial school. There has been the lifetime sucrifice of all that the world holds legitimately dear on the part of your teachers; there has been the constant and anxious solicitude as well as the Anancal worries of your pastor in maintaining this school; to say nothing of the misunderstandings of our non-Catholic friends and neighbors over the purpose and function of our parochial school system. All these factors must be taken into considerstion in order for you to appreciate properly what you have accomplished tonight.

"We may better appreciate the task that has faced your parrats and will face you if we borrow from the phraseology of the present war to state that we, all Cath-olics are engaged, have been engaged in, and will be engaged in an all out war against the enemy of God and the enemy of man. And it has always been and will be a total war, engaging every possible means, and every single peron, and anything at all that will disarm the common enemy of God and Man, the Dovil.

"Your training, my dear young people began very carly for the struggle that you will be engaged in till the very end of your lives. If you seek the why and wherefore of all the extra burdens that Catholics take upon themselves, there is the briefest and clearest answer. What will be your contribution to this great struggle? The salvation of your own soul: One thing is necessary, your salvation" God, own soul. You can best contribute to the welfare of your family, your party parish, your city, your country and hall. your Church, if you concentrate all your efforts on this one thing of saving your own soul.

This war is not merely another war on the old pattern and for the usual aims of the past wars of histury It is a struggle such as would defy the very epic powers of Homor, Girgil, Dante and Milton to describe. For we are in the throes of a world-wide revolution. This is what I would warn you of tonight, when I say that now you're going to begin to carry your own crosses."
