The funeral service and burial took place in Etma, Iowa.

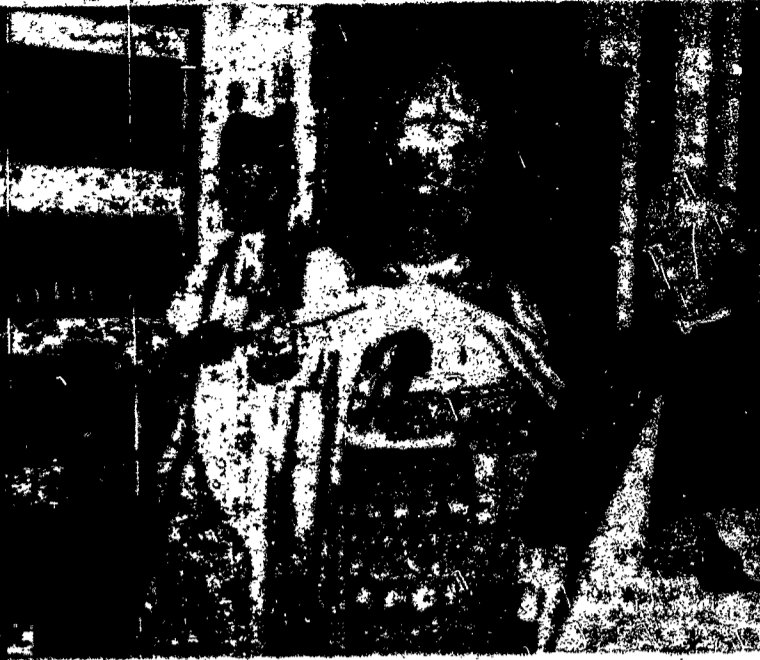
