From the War Fronts
Chungking — Bishop Donaghy of Maryknoll reports that Catholic Church life in South China continues intact despite the many obstacles in the way. "Prices are shooting up like sky rockets. We must decide immediately whether to continue our schools and seminary another year. The future life of the Church in South China rests upon this decision and we are ready to go hungry rather than sacrifice them."
Wather Tennien reports that Chungking is a graveyard. The four Catholic Churches are flat. The people are living in half-houses. Commenting on the prices of living in China, Father Tennien says "one of our priests bought a can of milk yesterday to the tune of \$60. A new house in the country, about ten rooms, is asking the American Embassy \$8,000-a month rent. That is national currency."
Kaying, South China — Bishop Ford reports from Kaying that "medicines are now sky-high." "One bill for medicines recently was \$1,000 National." "Quinine sells for \$1 a pill." This means that we shall soon have a serious epidemic of malaria and serious fevers. Those who have escaped death or injury as a result of actual warfare are apt to be the victims of this epidemic.
Philippine Islands — Efforts have been made through the American Red Cross to establish a Red Cross delegation in Manila. To date the Japanese government has refused to take action on this suggestion. Information received from authoritative sources would give the impression that "while Americans in Manila are by no means in comfortable circumstances, their lives are not in danger." In some instances the missionaries are permitted by the Japanese to continue their ordinary activities.
Culion Colony, Cebu, P. I. — It was reported that in January of this year the Leper Colony had in storage sufficient food for three months. Efforts have been made to replenish the food supply but thus far these efforts have proved unsuccessful. Three ships on the way to Culion with food were definitely reported sunk, and no information has been received from any ship getting through. The Red Cross has consulted with Tokyo regarding the matter but so far no information with regard to the Leper Colony has been forthcoming.

As was reported in the secular press, all Maryknoll priests and Sisters stationed in Japan or its provinces are being evacuated as exchange prisoners. They will be returned to this country and many of them missioned to Bolivia, South America.
The privations of Maryknoll priests and Sisters as reported in secular periodicals recently are being investigated. It is the fervent hope and prayer of every Catholic that the instances as reported are unfounded. Thus far it is our belief that whereas their activities have been severely hampered and their supplies greatly reduced, they have been permitted to operate under certain restrictions.
Their little flocks of new Christians who are left shepherdless by the order of the Japanese government must become the prayerful concern of every Catholic. Every day we should pray God to give them strength and Faith sufficient to carry on loyally in His service without the leadership and guidance of their priests and Sisters.
