"To remain near and dear to those who have gone from this world" is one of the most serious responsibilities, "we in the Catholic Church," have, His Excellency, Bishop Kearney told 2,000 members of the Knights of St. John, Ladies' Auxiliaries, and relatives and friends of the deceased at the annual Memorial Field Mass, Sunday.

The Mass of the Feast of St. John the Baptist was celebrated, within the octave, by Bishop Kearney at the outdoor altar in a natural setting on the east side of Holy Sepulchre Cemetery. Impressive and colorful was the ceremony with the American and regimental colors grouped about the altar, the knights in full dress uniforms and the Ladies' Auxiliary

of St. Bernard's Seminary, and the Rev. Dr. Joseph H. Gaffel, regimental chaplain. At the conclusion of the Mass, the roll of honored dead for the past year, which included high ranking officers of both knights and ladies including Supreme President Mrs. Teresa Ganster of the Auxiliary, was read by Father Gaffel. "Tape" was sounded high on the hill by Miss Rita Hofmayer.

The Church's concern for the human body as well as the immortal soul was stressed by the Bishop as he emphasized that the Church does not allow cremation. But the Church's concern for the immortal soul calls for concern by the faithful "not even when it is felt that the soul for whom we pray is in heaven, would we want it said in days to come that we had forgotten that soul."

The Bishop was escorted from the Cemetery office to the altar by the entire Rochester Regiment and Ladies' Auxiliary drill companies in command of Col. Frederick J. Wegman.

A special escort was furnished by Supreme President Frank H. Biel of Rochester, together with Col. Philip Gerhard and Buffalo Regi-

ment Staff Officers and Lt. Col. Paul Peters of Syracuse.

Music was furnished by the Knights of St. John choir, directed by Fred Frederick of York.

At the conclusion of the Mass and recessional from the outdoor altar, a special ceremony of "Installation of the Colors" was conducted for the first time on the west side of Holy Sepulchre Cemetery. Headed by the band, the colors and staff officers, marched by the knights and ladies drawn up in company front and the Regiment was then dismissed.
