C.D.A. Raise Fund For Soldiers' Kits

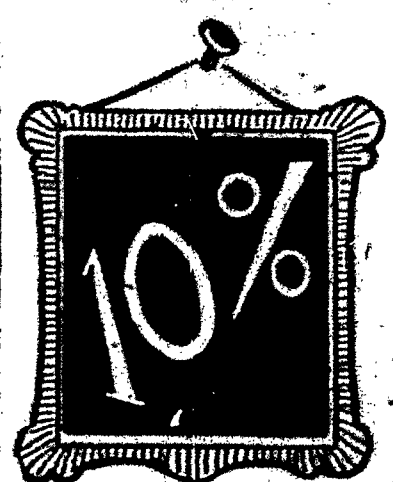

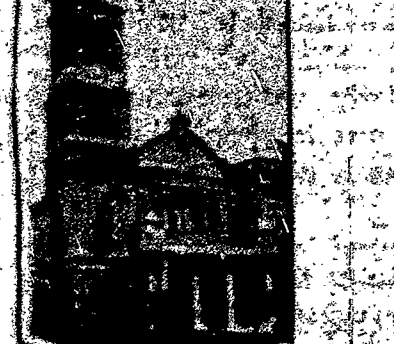
