## John Ammering Heads State Credit Unions

John J. Ammering of St. Monica's parish was elected president of the New York State Credit Union League, Inc., at the 22nd Annual Convention at Lawrence County, Sachssville, Monticello, on June 2, 3 and 4. Mr. Ammering is nationally known for his work in the credit union movement.

Approximately 800 delegates attended representing 200 Credit Unions throughout New York State. Delegates of the 25 Rochester credit unions were represented including four of the five Parish Credit Unions. These were: Holy Family Parish, represented by Charles Miller; St. Andrew's Parish, Henry L. Schuster and Frank A. Schneider; Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish, Charles Mura and St. Peter and Paul's Parish, John Keegan.

### War Bonds Added

Special emphasis in the business sessions of the convention was placed on Credit Unions using all available surplus funds for the purchase of War Bonds. Credit Unions pledged another \$1,000,000 War Bond purchase to be added to the several million already held by the New York State Credit Unions.

The Rochester Credit Unions alone hold and have sold to members approximately \$1,000,000 in War Bonds and Stamps to date.

One of the highlights of the convention's social program was the Rochester Party, an annual affair, held in charge of Frank A. Schneider and Benjamin Lipsch. Past Office Credit Unions of the Bronx, Long Island and Jamaica joined with the Rochester groups.

The Rochester delegates through Benjamin Lipsch, former Rochester Chapter president, extended an invitation to hold the next convention in Rochester.
