Train High Graduates For Wartime Jobs

'Quick training for a war plant job will help win the war,' said Vernis A. Bird, Assistant Superintendent of Schools in Rochester and Director of VEMED, in urging all recent high school graduates, both boys and girls, to train now for the job they can get next fall in helping to step-up war production.

Mr. Bird said, 'Now is the time to register for training to help with improved quality and increased production - tomorrow may be too late.'

Thousands have been trained for the past two years and have been placed in good paying jobs. War industries are in need of thousands of trained workers to man the assembly lines. Men and women of all ages and of all walks of life should begin to recognize the need for enlisting in the manpower army to tackle the job of winning the war through production.

The quicker that we can get prepared as a nation, the shorter will be the World War and fewer will be the sacrifices.

Enroll now for war job training by writing the Board of Education, 13 S. Fitzhugh St., Rochester, N. Y., or call Main 2600, extension 32. Classes are running twenty-four hours a day at all of the high schools. Two hundred and fifty-seven women were assigned to training last week in machine shop, light assembly, U. S. Army Ordnance Inspection, drafting and blue print reading. This brings the total of women being trained to eleven hundred. Over forty-five hundred men and women are now being trained. Men are needed for immediate training in aviation ground school, machine shop, welding, Army Ordnance Inspection, radio communications and sheet metal classes.
