

Edward Hanna Enlists In U. S. Coast Guard

Third son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank N. Hanna, 59 Wellington Ave., Rochester, to enter the armed forces is Edward L. Hanna, chief parole and probation officer for the U. S. District Court of Western New York, who is reporting for active duty with the Coast Guard at Cleveland, Ohio.

Hanna has received his commission as lieutenant, junior grade, in the U. S. Coast Guard Reserve. He has been granted a leave of absence by Federal Judges Harold P. Burke and John Knight.

A brother, Capt. Austin B. Hanna, is assigned as chaplain at the War College, Washington, and another brother, Corp. Adrian M. Hanna is stationed at Pine Camp.

Lieutenant Hanna is a member of St. Augustine's parish and of Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus, and Rochester Fourth Degree Assembly.

He was Deputy U. S. Marshal from 1927 to 1931 and in January, 1931, was appointed probation and parole officer and organized the system in Buffalo which covers 17 counties in Western New York.

In the tour of duty he has been a frequent visitor to Elmira where he visited with another brother, the Rev. Bernard D. Hanna, pastor of St. Anthony's Church.
