Arab Monsignor

JERUSALEM. The death here of Msgr. Emmanuel Habash of the Latin Patriarchate, a Canon of the Holy Sepulchre, has brought to the Catholics of the Holy Land their second similar bereavement within a few weeks. Msgr. Habash labored for many years, both for the English-speaking Catholics here and among his own Arab people. At the beginning of Lent occurred the death of Msgr. Yusuf Morcos, another native priest of the Latin Patriarchate.
