Parish Bids Farewell To Father Agonis

AUBURN—For the third time within a year St. Mary's Parishioners are bidding farewell to one of their assistant pastors, Father Edwin Agonis, O.M.C. who was assigned to St. Mary's on Nov. 4, left this week to take up his new duties. Father Edwin comes from Bridgport, Conn., received his grammar school education here, attended Boarding School in Buffalo, and pursued his college and missionary work in Montreal, Massachusetts and abroad. He was ordained on July 6, 1941 as a member of Missions Conventuals. While attending the Seminary he was chosen by the faculty to study abroad and was sent to Poland.

It was on August 14, 1937, the day before the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary that Father Edwin reached Poland and had the privilege of attending the great religious celebration in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary for Poland in world famous for its devotion to Our Lady.

While attending the University in Poland Father Edwin took a tour of the foreign countries and acquired a broad knowledge of their people. All too soon his student days abroad were over for war was declared and the students were told to return to their seminaries in America.

Since coming to Auburn Father Edwin has been in constant demand as a speaker. His talks on conditions in Russia and Poland were most informative and most interesting. His judgment of conditions in foreign countries was sound and based on facts and nearly every organization in Auburn, both civic and parochial, has had the privilege of hearing his addresses. He great and varied were his experiences that each time he spoke he was able to give an entirely new address.

Although Father Edwin knew when he came to Auburn that his stay would be short, he has been one of the most active and interested priests in the welfare of the church and the school. The children found in him a special friend and welcomed him most heartily to every function. No gathering of the organizations was complete without his presence and he will be missed by the people of the parish. St. Mary's are grateful to him and appreciate of all that he has done. They can only wish for him the success which he deserves in all his undertakings, all happiness and fruitful labor in the cause of Christ and a prayer that his fondest hopes will be realized.

In his place comes the Rev. Richard Torney, a newly ordained priest. Father Torney comes from Rochester, is a graduate of Holy Rosary School and St. Andrew's Seminary and is a member of the Class of 1942 of St. Bernard's Seminary. The people of St. Mary's parish extend to him a warm welcome.

Plans For Future
Rev. Dr. William E. Cowen, pastor of St. Mary's Church, pointed out to the graduates of East High School that the future under God was in their hands and that their lives will be what they make them.

As a solid foundation for happiness he placed the words of the Text "Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and to God the things that are God's." He said in part, "It is not a difficult thing for us in America to render to the civil authorities the obedience and loyalty to which it has a right by divine order. We have enjoyed so many blessings in this country of freedom and democratic ways. The duties of our government up to this time have not been burdensome or exacting. It's no problem today because the generations which have gone before have not hesitated to endure privations, to undergo hardships, to struggle, and to give their all on its behalf. And if I call for sacrifice now, this is only in keeping with the traditions of the past.

"After all life teaches us that it is only by sacrifice that anything worthwhile can either be secured or preserved. Be mindful of the things your country has done for you. Do not forget the principles of government which have made life possible. Never associate yourself with attempts to tear down or destroy the things which time has proved to be of inestimable value. Give your loyalty and your devotion to America to which you owe so much.

"No life is happy which does not have God in it. The ten commandments are the enactment of infinite wisdom shaped to enable us to realize the best that life can offer for every individual. They were not intended to be a burden but rather a light and a help. The observance of them is sure to bring happiness. Our very nature calls out for God and we can never have peace or happiness without Him.

"Be prayerful, worship God, keep the commandments, keep your consciences pure and your lives good and you will experience the full measure of happiness which man can look for in this world. Hold your school in grateful memory and so live that the sacrifices made to build it and to carry it on have not been made in vain."
