

Father Erb Enlists As Army Chaplain

A Society of the Divine Word Father, the Rev. Charles G. Erb, S.V.D., has received his commission as First Lieutenant-Chaplain in the United States Army and has been assigned to the 55th Pursuit Group reporting at Paine Field, near Everett, Washington.

Father Erb is the son of Mrs. Helen C. Erb, 17 Audin St. with whom he had a short visit prior to reporting for duty.

He made his early studies at Holy Family School in Rochester and then attended Sacred Heart House at Girard, Pa. Higher studies were pursued at St. Mary's Mission House, the Society of the Divine Word college at Techny, Ill. He was ordained at St. Gabriel's Seminary, Vienna, Austria on May 23, 1933.

Since his ordination, Father Erb has taught English, German and Elocution, in various seminaries of the Society of the Divine Word in the United States. His work as editor of the children's magazine, "The Little Missionary" has made him widely known.
