Nephew Offers Funeral Mass For John Carroll

Funeral services for John C. Carroll, father of two sons, were conducted Monday morning, July 6, 1942, at 8:30 A. M. from the home of another daughter, Mrs. John J. Donnelly Jr., 12 Maple Place and at 9 A. M. at Immaculate Conception Church.

Mr. Carroll, who died July 1, 1942, was the father of Sister Claudia of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph and Sister Paul Frances of the Franciscan community at Allegheny, N. Y.

Solemn Requiem Mass was offered by the Rev. Dr. Howard J. Carroll, Assistant General Secretary, National Catholic Welfare Conference, Washington, a nephew. Deacon was the Rev. George Wood and Subdeacon was Paul Carroll, C.S.P., son of the deceased.

In the Sanctuary were the Rt. Rev. Magr. Joseph S. Cameron, the Rt. Rev. Magr. Joseph E. Grady, the Rev. Peter Bergen, C.S.P., of Washington; the Rev. Thomas F. Connors, the Rev. Interment was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery where the final blessing was imparted by Monsignor Cameron assisted by the Rev. Dr. Howard Carroll and the Rev. Peter Bergen, C.S.P.

Mr. Carroll is survived by his wife, Mary Carroll, and besides his son, Paul, in the Passionist Congregation, seven other sons: John of Washington, D. C.; Vincent, Emmett, Franklin, Bradley, Joseph and Robert of Rochester; his four daughters, Mrs. John J. Donnelly, Jr., Sister Claudia, Sister Paul Frances, and Rita Carroll of New York City, two brothers, Thomas K., of Rochester, and Michael, of Syracuse.

Other nephews, brothers of the celebrant of the requiem Mass, are the Rev. Dr. Walter S. Carroll attached to the Papal Secretariate of State at Vatican City, who a year ago on June 29, 1941, gave the English translation of the Holy Father's radio address to the world and the Rev. Coleman Carroll, assistant pastor, St. Scholastica's Church, Aspinwall, Pa.

Mr. Carroll was a member of the Holy Name Society of Immaculate Conception Church, a life member of the Elks and a member of the J. A. W. B.
