of religion textbooks by the Rev. Leon A. McNeill and Madeline Aaron of Wichita, Kans. has been completed. It was announced by the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine today. "The Words of Truth," third book in the series, is based on the Creed and is designed for children in Confraternity classes both

school-year religious instruction classes and religious vacation schools. It is a development of the revised Baltimore Catechism, No. 2, presented in the language of the child and enriched with study assignments and test exercises. Father McNeill is Chairman of the Elementary Manual Committee of the Confraternity.
