## 100,000 Bibles For Navy

NEW YORK — A new edition of 100,000 copies of the New Testament is being distributed to American sailors, marines and coast guardsmen, the Military Ordinance here announced today. The text is the new translation prepared by the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine and has been arranged in this edition by the Rev. Joseph C. Stedman.

The Most Rev. John F. O'Hara, C.S.C., Military Delegate, said the distribution was made possible by funds contributed by the American Bishops' War Emergency and Relief Committee. The new edition, he said, will be similar to the copies of the New Testament being distributed to soldiers of the

American army from funds provided by an Act of Congress.

The Chaplains' Aid Association at 10 East 33d Street will distribute the New Testaments to members of the sea forces and through the Catholic chaplains assigned to the services. The edition, with a special blue cover, contains readings of the epistles and gospels arranged for daily reading and an outline Ordinary of the Mass to facilitate use of the New Testament in connection with daily Mass.
