GENEVA.—Opening of the diocesan-wide Institute to train women volunteers for service with parish, patriotic and charitable institutions will take place in Lewis Hall, Women's Building, here on Monday, July 13. Sessions will be at 9:30 and 10 A. M. and at 2 P. M. Other conferences will be held in Rochester, July 14, at Columbus Civic Centre; Auburn, July 16, and Elmira, July 17.

Sponsored by the Rochester Diocesan Council of Catholic Women and the Rochester Diocesan Charities and conducted by the National Council of Catholic Women and the National Conference of Catholic Charities, the conference will bring to Geneva outstanding leaders in the fields of Catholic laywomen's organization and charity work.
National leaders to participate will be the Rt. Rev. Magr. John O'Grady, executive secretary of National Conference of Catholic Charities, Washington, D. C.; Miss Irma Biemba, of the National Council of Catholic Women, and Mrs. Lee Kenny, national chairman of the N. C. C. W. Committee on Cooperating with Catholic Charities, of Fremont, Ohio.

In attendance at the sessions will be the Rev. Leo C. Mooney, spiritual director, Rochester Diocesan Council, N. C. C. W.; the Rev. Gerald C. Lambert, diocesan director, Rochester Catholic Charities; Miss Cecelia M. Yawman, diocesan president, N. C. C. W., and Mrs. Louis A. Lungie, Diocesan Chairman, Committee on Cooperating with Catholic Charities, Rochester, Diocesan Council, N. C. C. W.

Women in the Geneva deanery will be given the opportunity to hear discussed and join in the discussion of "A Call to Service," manual recently issued jointly by the National Council of Catholic Women and the National Conference of Catholic Charities. Copies of the manual will be available at the Conference.

New ideas on volunteer work within the parish, the community, and the diocese, gathered from nation-wide experiences will be brought out. Specific discussion will be centered on opportunities in the community for cooperation and work with the state and local civil protection councils, American Red Cross, U. S. A., public health, public welfare, juvenile court work and institutional work.

GOA, India.—The Most Rev. Jose da Costa Nunes, Archbishop of Goa and Patriarch of the East Indies, has returned safely to his Archiepiscopal See from Macao, off the China coast, the easternmost Diocese of his vast ecclesiastical Province.

His Excellency left Macao last November, shortly before the attack on Pearl Harbor, and reached the shores of India safely after staying for some time at Manila, P. I., and Colombo, Ceylon. En route, he stayed for a few days at Mysapore, India, as the guest of the Most Rev. Manuel de Medeiros Gouveia, Bishop of St. Thomas of Mysapore.

'Dies in Japan
