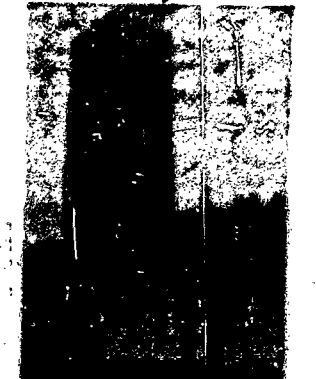

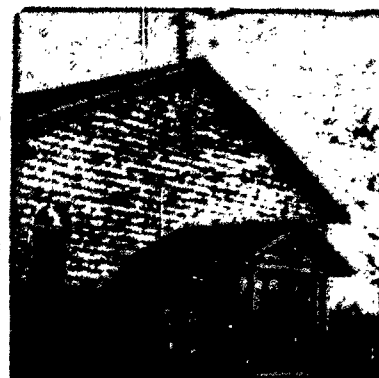
NCCS Opens Women's War Workers' Club
