Flays 'Planned Parenthood'

EL PASO Tex. Organizations whose object is to encourage and put into practice "planned parenthood" were denounced by the Most Rev. Sidney M. Metzger, Coadjutor Bishop of El Paso, in an address before the Catholic Trust Society here. "The term 'planned parenthood' as understood and practiced by these organizations is, in its final analysis, a name for a sinful practice which is purely human interference with the order intended by nature and nature's God," Bishop Metzger declared. "We must expect," His Excellency added, "that birth control appeals to a materialistic, hedonistic age which makes religion a synthesis of human opinions and usurps God's right to control, while ignoring or perhaps not knowing the natural law, will put forth specious arguments to win human appeal. In all these argu-

ments morality is conspicuous for its absence and is replaced by 'morale.' "When our citizen substitute their human plans for the natural moral order established by nature's God, they become accessories to a long but inevitable process of national self-destruction. Each studio will offer a local prize of \$25 War Bond. Other valuable prizes will be awarded, bringing the total of prizes to 450. "Any youngster of fourteen years or under may enter the contest. The only entrance requirement is that a picture be taken in either of the Sibley, Lindsay & Carr photograph studios, between Thursday, July 16, and Saturday, Sept. 12. All you do to enter the contest is have the picture taken. You get the picture. The studio tends to all the other details. Having your child's picture taken automatically enters him or her in the contest. That's all there is to it—no fuss—no red tape—no bother. "Beauty does not count in this contest. Freckles and a snub nose are as important to the judges as curls and dimples. The winners will be selected for character and personality as portrayed in the photographs."
