TRIDUUM TO ST. ANNE

AUBURN - The Feast of St. Anne, mother of our Blessed Lady, will be observed on Sunday, July 26. The annual triduum in her honor will be held in St. Mary's Church beginning on Thursday evening, July 23rd, at 7:30 and coming to a close on Sunday morning. There will be Masses at 8, 9 and 8:00 o'clock on Friday and Saturday mornings with services on Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings consisting of Special Prayers to St. Anne, Sermon, Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament and Veneration of the Relic of St. Anne.

St. Anne is the mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary. She was married to a man called Joachim whose feast holy Mother Church celebrates on August 16. Anne and Joachim lived and died in Palestine. St. Anne became a great saint and the worthy mother of the Blessed Virgin after twenty years of trust in God and earnest prayer. St. Anne holds a place of honor in the United States.

The first missionaries of North America came from France at a time when St. Anne was becoming very famous through her Shrine in Brittany. The missionaries spoke of St. Anne and spread her devotion. The fame of the Shrine of St. Anne de Beaupre which goes back to the early days of French Canada contributed to the popularity of St. Anne in America.

When the large relic of St. Anne was brought from Rome to Canada in May 1872, Msgr. Marquis stopped in New York at St. John the Baptist's Church and exposed the Relic to the veneration of the faithful. It was estimated that 175,000 people visited the church during the

three weeks the Relic was exposed. Many miracles occurred during this period which helped to increase devotion to St. Anne. Many pilgrimages are made to the Shrine in Quebec each year to make the Solenn Novena, to climb the Holy Stairs, to make the Stations of the Cross bordering on the path up the Hill and to drink of St. Anne's water.

The following prayer to St. Anne is published by the Annals of St. Anne: "O Good St. Anne, behold how much I suffer from this my sickness. Together with the body, my soul is also afflicted. I have not even strength to say a prayer as I ought to do. Nothing is able to give me any relief. Even the visit and compassion of my friends does not give me any comfort. Hence my courage begins to fail, impatience and sadness oppress my soul. In this my great distress I put all my trust in thee, most tender of all mothers. Thy compassionate heart will certainly have pity on us. Yes, most merciful mother, Thou wilt not forget Thy poor afflicted child. Obtain then for me courage and strength to accept all these trials from the hand of God with patience and resignation. If it is for the good of my soul, grant that I may recover my former health. But if it is the will of God that I should suffer still longer, or that this sickness should lead me to a better life, I am perfectly resigned, for I am sure that Thou, O loving Mother, wilt obtain for me the grace to do whatever God demands of me. Amen."

2 Maryknoll Priests Reported On List For U. S.-Japan Exchange

WASHINGTON - Two Maryknoll missionary priests are included in a preliminary list of persons expected to proceed shortly from the Far East to Laurence Marques, Portuguese East Africa, in connection with the exchange of official and non-official persons between the United States and Japan and certain Japanese-controlled territories in the Orient, it has been reported here.

The priests mentioned are Fathers Joseph Early and Stanislaus Ziemia. The exchange will be effected at Laurence Marques and from that port the persons exchanged will travel to New York on one of the voyages of the S.S. "Gripsholm."

Archbishop Lauds U.S. Aid To Australia

BRISBANE, Australia. - Appreciation of all Australians at the generous extent of the aid being sent to Australia from "our great friend on the other side of the Pacific" was voiced by the Most Rev. James Duhig, Archbishop of Brisbane, in the course of a sermon at St. Stephen's Cathedral, here.

Declaring that, now that the warship restrictions have been lifted on the matter of United States aid, it is possible publicly to speak of the assistance rendered from our American allies, His Grace declared:

"They have come to us in great numbers, with ample equipment and abundant stores, and above all with a great heart, to join Australia's sons in waging a war for victory. There have been few so happy combinations in modern times as this one, of Australia and America, that we find an established fact today." The Archbishop added that American aid "will go down in history as the most friendly act ever done by one country to another."

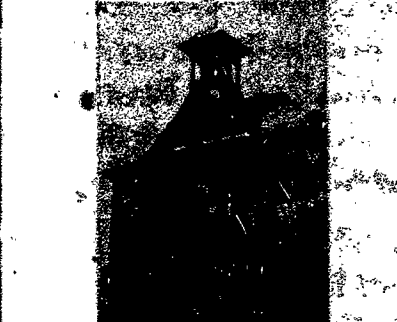
