Classes As Usual At St. Bonaventure's As Flood Threatens

ST. BONAVENTURE. — "Classes being held as usual" was the announcement given July 18 at noon by Rev. Aurelius Loop, O.F.M., Registrar of St. Bonaventure College and Dean of Studies for the college summer school, as Olean and vicinity fought the worst electrical storm experienced in years. Since no damage, outside of electrical difficulties, had occurred up to noon, and the water had not risen high enough to make the walk from Devereux Hall Dormitory to the administration building impossible, it was decided not to cancel classes unless the situation becomes more acute.

Emergency calls from Olean and Bradford, located near St. Bonaventure College, indicated the seriousness of the storm, as these cities enlisted the aid of all boat-owners in an evacuation of the lower parts of the district. Fr. Cornelius Welch, O.F.M., Acting Registrar at St. Bonaventure College, reported difficulty in returning from Bradford after he had said Mass in that city earlier this morning.

In following the "around-the-calendar" operation in accordance with the accelerated study program arranged at the request of government authorities as a wartime measure, the acting Dean of Studies feels that every class is vitally important, and is reluctant to cancel any until absolutely necessary.

The curriculum being offered in the summer session program includes a full variety of subjects under the following departmental subdivisions:

Arts and Letters—English, Modern languages, Ancient languages, Fine arts, including free-hand drawing, oil painting, etc.

Philosophy and Related Sciences: Philosophy, Ethics, Psychology, History, Social Sciences, Economics, Political Science, Education.

Natural Sciences and Mathematics: Biology, Histology, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics.

Students graduating from high school this year, and intending to enroll as freshmen at St. Bonaventure during the fall, as well as men and women taking graduate work, are enabled to complete a full year's course in any subjects they desire during the regular summer school. Preparation for officers' commissions in the Army, Air Force Reserve, Navy and Marine Reserve corps is given to those signing up under the various government plans offered.

priests serving with the Polish forces fighting with the Russians against Germany.

Other funds allotted were \$10,000 for the aid of Lithuanian war victims and \$20,000 to Slovenian aid.

With the ravages of war being felt on so many more fronts, the responsibility grows for the Catholic people in the United States. The universality of Catholic charity is being tested. A generous response to Bishop Kearney's appeal will demonstrate that Rochester dioceses are doing more than their share in supporting the "War Emergency and Relief" work of the U. S. Hierarchy.

Cost-of-Living Bonus

Montreal.—The Montreal Catholic School Commission has granted cost-of-living bonuses to all teachers and other members of their staff earning less than \$3,000 a year. The bonuses range from \$45 for religious Order teachers to \$100 a year for married male teachers.

Auxiliary Bishop Appointed For Ukrainians In U. S.

WASHINGTON. — (NC) — Information received at the Apostolic Delegation from Vatican City announces the appointment of the Very Rev. Ambrose Andrew Senyshin, O.S.B.M., Rector of St. Nicholas' Church, Chicago, and Superior of the Basilian Community in that city, as Titular Bishop of Mainz and Auxiliary to the Most Rev. Constantine Bohachevsky, Bishop of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Diocese in the United States.

Bishop-elect Senyshin was educated in the Monastery Colleges of Krechiv and Lawriw, in Galicia.

He made his philosophy studies at Sobromil, Galicia, and his theology studies at Crystynopol, Galicia, and at Warsaw. He was ordained a priest of the Basilian Order on Aug. 23, 1931, at Krechiv by Bishop Josephat Kocytowski.

It was at St. Nicholas' Church, largest of all the Ukrainian Greek Catholic churches in the Americas, that the First Diocesan Eucharistic Congress of the Eastern Rites in this country was held in June, 1941. Prominent among those participating in this Congress were His Excellency the Most Rev. Amleto Giovanni Cicognani, Apostolic Delegate to the United States, the Most Rev. Samuel A. Stritch, Archbishop of Chicago, and Bishop Bohachevsky, whose Auxiliary Bishop-elect Senyshin now becomes.
