Of St. Joseph Order

Two deaths occurred during the past week among the Sisters of the Congregation of St. Joseph. Sister Stephen Marie O'Hara died on July 16 and Sister Mary Edwin King was called to her eternal reward on July 21.

Funeral services for Sister Stephen Marie O'Hara of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph were held Thursday morning, July 16, in Holy Family Chapel at Nazareth Convent, East Ave., Pittsford.

Solemn Mass of Requiem was offered by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. George V. Burns as celebrant with the Rev. William McPadden, Geneva, Deacon, and the Rev. L. Emmett Davis, Rochester. The Rev. John T. Callahan was master of ceremony. Acolytes were the Rev. Charles J. McCarthy and the Rev. Joseph A. Cirincione.

In the Sanctuary were the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Charles F. Blug, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Joseph E. Grady, the Rev. Dr. Edward J. Lintz, the Rev. Alphonsus P. Crimmins, the Rev. Michael J. Krog, the Rev. John M. For more than 25 years, Sister Stephen Marie, who died July 16, had taught in the parish schools of the diocese including St. Mary's, Canandaigua; Nativity School, Brockport; St. Mary's School, Auburn; and Cathedral, Holy Rosary and Sacred Heart Schools in Rochester.

Sister Mary Edwin King of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph died Tuesday night, July 21, at the convent of St. Monica's School following a very brief illness.

During her ten years in the community Sister taught at St. Monica's School and also at St. Stephen's School, Geneva.

Funeral service will be conducted at St. Monica's Church on Saturday morning, July 23, at 10 A. M.

Sister is survived by her mother, Mrs. Beale King of 99 Genesee St.; two brothers, Daniel and John, and one sister, Jeanne.

Rites Held For Franciscan  
Nun Formerly of Rochester

Sister M. Ernestine Pierce, a member of the order of the Sisters of St. Francis, and a former Rochesterian, died July 16, 1942 in St. Francis Hospital, Olean. She had been ill for two years.

Sister Ernestine had been a member of the St. Francis Order for thirty years. She had taught in many parts of the country, including Florida, Long Island and Buffalo.

Surviving are two sisters, Mrs. Anna F. Kennedy and Mrs. George W. Love, and several nieces and nephews in Rochester. Funeral was held Saturday, July 18 at St. Elizabeth's Convent, Allegany.

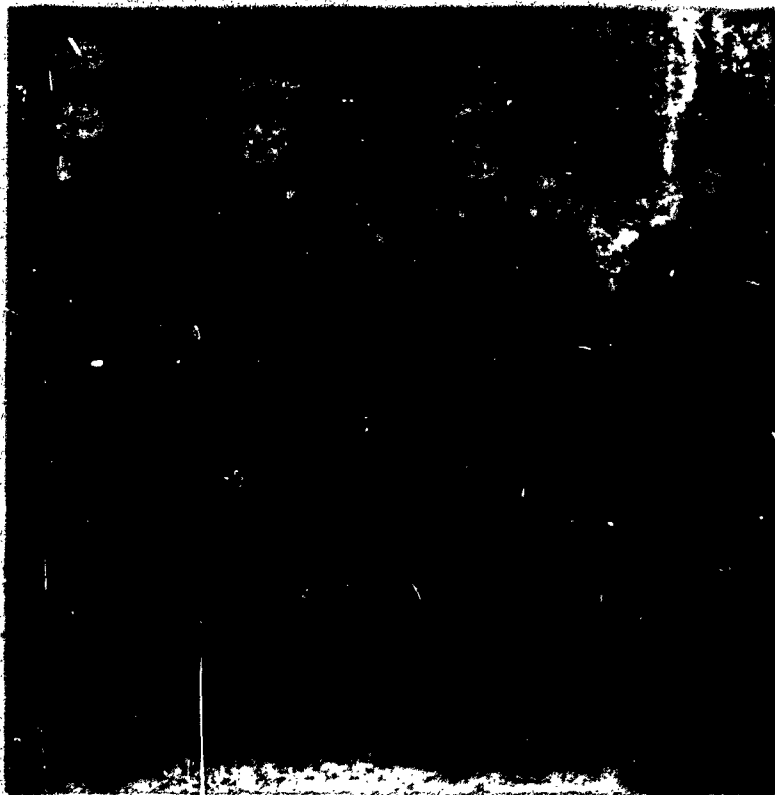
Rules Governing Garb  
Of Women at Church  
Reemphasized at Vatican

VATICAN CITY. (NC-Radio) — The Christian rules of morality governing the dress of women for attendance at church remain unchanged, an article in *Osservatore Romano* points out, and the faithful are reminded of their obligation to observe the norms of Christian modesty and decency.

The article is said to have been published in view of the report spread abroad that women are permitted to attend church without stockings. It is a fact that, because of the scarcity and high price of stockings, women are allowed to go without them in the Vatican Basilica, but all the other rules governing feminine attire must be strictly observed.

Mrs. T. A. Kane of Geneva was most gracious in her hospitality to our out-of-town speakers.

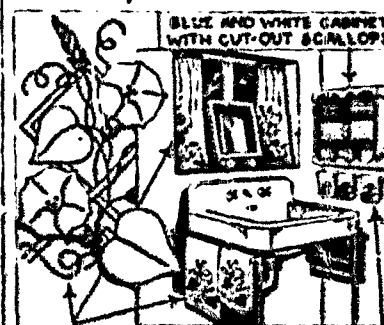
The Catholic Daughters of Auburn opened their beautiful home to us for the meeting and were most helpful.

A Morning Glory Bathroom Whatever the limitations that priorities may place on new bathroom fixtures there is no limit on the gay color and good cheer that you may have with brightly painted cupboards and towels decorated

with pieces from your scrap bag. In this bathroom a morning glory applique design is used for towels of two sizes and for curtains. The handy towel and lotion cupboard is painted white outside and morning glory blue inside. The sides, top and bottom are screwed together at the corners. Use half-inch metal angles as shell supports, or make grooves for a neater job. As shown in the sketch, the cupboard is trimmed and made rigid with plywood scallops secured with half-inch screws.

Note: Here is news for the man with hammer and saw. Whether you have a coping saw from the dime store or an expensive band saw, you may now make cut-out scallops for any purpose desired. Pattern No. 207 includes scallops from one and a half inches to nineteen inches; together with numerous illustrations of their use in home decoration. The lady with needle and thread will want pattern No. 202 with ten hot iron transfers of the Morning Glory designs. Patterns are 15c each.
