Fr. Manley Heard At Rite Marking Scapular Feast

NEW YORK — The national shrine of Our Lady of the Scapular of Mount Carmel in East side New York was the center of even international attention on July 16 as the Scapular feast was duly celebrated with a colorful parade under a perfect sky and impressive religious-patriotic ceremonies that packed the shrine to overflowing.

(The Rev. Thomas J. Manley, reported here as preaching the sermon at the shrine, is a priest of the Rochester diocese. Formerly assistant pastor at Our Lady of Lourdes parish, he left there in April 1941 to take up his duties as an army chaplain.)

Several thousand persons participated in the demonstration which attracted visitors from distant cities and even outside the state and which brought to a fine climax the national drive sponsored by the Scapular Militia to mobilize some 1,000,000 American Scapular-wearers among the Armed Forces of the United States and among their "folks back home."

Over one hundred Catholic military chaplains working in union with the Scapular Militia are holding similar enthusiastic enrollments and rededication ceremonies for their men with Scapulars provided gratis by the Militia. One chaplain needed and asked for five times the amount of Scapulars originally requested, while in another camp the chaplains, acting together in a fine spirit of Marian cooperation, asked for and were sent a shipment of 5,000 Scapular Militia packets.

Leading the New York Scapular parade were the colors and the color guard of the Father Duffy Chapter, 105 U. S. (69th N. Y.) Infantry, Rainbow Division of Veterans, 42; both the Catholic War Veterans and the American Legion also sent delegations. National Catholic organization like the Knights of Columbus, the Catholic Daughters of America, and the Sodality of Our Lady were also represented. Bands from the well-known Madison Square Boys' Club of New York and from the C. Y. O. of the Brooklyn diocese added color and music.

Fr. Manley Speaks
Among those in the reviewing stand were the Most Rev. Hilary M. Coakley, Superior General of the Carmelites throughout the world and celebrant of the Solemn Carmelite High Mass that followed the parade, the Hon. James Fay, former United States Congressman, and the Rev. Capt. Thomas J. Manley, Catholic chaplain at Fort Totten, who preached the sermon.

In a memorable discourse Father Manley vividly retold the story of the Scapular vision, in the year 1251, to the aged and over-burdened Carmelite Prior General, St. Simon Stock, and from his own experience highly commended the Carmelite Fathers for their zeal in bringing the Scapular with Mary's Scapular promise of eternal salvation to every Catholic Service man. Especially did he insist on the value of the Scapular for those men in the Service who are kept by circumstances from the spiritual contacts that are so necessary to them.

"If during the war we win in material assets but lose the greater spiritual values, the victory will be a shallow one," he declared. "It is necessary, therefore, that we preserve our spiritual heritage."

At the conclusion of his eloquent discourse Father Manley led a deeply-moved congregation in the Scapular Militia pledge of allegiance to Our Lady of the Scapular. "Dearest Queen of Carmel and of Souls, who hast promised that anyone dying in thy Scapular shall be saved, I heroby promise that I shall wear thy most holy Scapular."

or at least the Scapular medal, faithfully until death."

Mass enrollment in the Brown Scapular by the Most Reverend Prior General of the Carmelites was followed by the Solemn High Mass celebrated according to the venerable, seven-century-old rite of the Order. Outside the church, meanwhile, a double flag-raising was accompanied by the community singing of the "Star Spangled Banner." The services were concluded with the Papal Blessing imparted by the Most Reverend Prior General in the name of the gloriously reigning Pope Pius XII.

During the entire day thereafter the national shrine received the many visitors bent on gaining the celebrated "Toties Quoties" indulgence granted to all Carmelite churches on the Scapular feast by His Holiness, Pope Leo XIII, of loving memory.

One of the highlights of the demonstration was the appearance of the third edition of "Mary In Her Scapular Promise" by John Mathias Haffert, of Sea Isle City, New Jersey. The new, low-priced edition of this Catholic best-seller with a masterly preface by the Right Reverend Fulton J. Sheen, was prepared especially for the Scapular Militia as its training manual, and the entire proceeds of this fifty cent edition will be devoted exclusively to supplying Scapulars gratis to Catholic Service men. The Scapular Militia, which has already distributed over 175,000 Scapulars and folders explaining the Scapular devotion to Service men and has provided for an additional 400,000 for the same purpose, has its central offices at the national shrine of Our Lady of the Scapular of Mount Carmel at 338 East 29 Street, New York City.
