R.G. & E. Company Continues Under Local Control

Although the voting trust agreement under which the Rochester Gas and Electric Corporation has been operating since July 15, 1932, expired recently there will be no change in the Board of Directors nor the management of the company, it was announced today.

"The company continues under local control," stated President Herman Russell. "This is done at the request of the trustees and with the approval of the Federal Court under whose direction the trustees are operating the Associated Gas and Electric Corporation and the Associated Gas and Electric Company, in the interest of the security holders of those two organizations."

Further emphasis on the continuance of local control was shown by the re-election of all the present officers as follows: President, Herman Russell; Vice-President, Joseph P. Haftenkamp; Secretary and Treasurer, Frederick H. Patterson. Assistant to the President, Robert E. Ginna; Assistant to the Vice-President, E. R. Crofts; Assistant Secretary, Paul J. W. Miller. Assistant Treasurer and Auditor, H. W. Nichols; Assistant Treasurer, Charles A. Tucker. The Board of Directors, chosen at a recent meeting, includes nine local men and three representatives of the A. G. & E. trustees.
