IN MEMORIAM

Last week, on Tuesday, July 14, one of the oldest members of the Parish passed on his eternal reward. Charles B. Claus, Sr., known affectionately as "Charlie" to three generations, was one of the most loyal parishioners that Holy Family has ever had. In 1890, the first Pastor of this Parish, Father Laurenzi, employed him as engineer and janitor. He was thus employed for forty-one years. Although his duties kept him occupied, often from morning until night, nevertheless he performed them with a cheerfulness which endeared him to all with whom he came in contact. For a period of fifty years he was a devoted member of the Parish Choir, acting as its director for half this time. His relations to Father Laurenzi, especially during the last years of this saintly priest's life, was that of a brother rather than that of an employee. His devotion and pride in serving Holy Family should merit him a constant remembrance in the prayers of every parishioner.

TEN COMMANDMENTS

The following is a copy of the Ten Commandments a Guide for Parents in educating their children during the summer vacation which appeared in the Weekly Parish Bulletin of Holy Family I—Daily Prayers—Children are forgetful, hence they need reminders to offer their prayers, morning, evening and mealtimes. IV—Recollection of Presence of God—Teach the lessons of God's Providence.

V—Companionship—Teach children to choose wisely their associates. Evil companions have spoiled moral ruin for many a boy and girl during vacation.

VI—Amusements—Are intended by God as a reward for past work and as a help to assist in future tasks, never as a goal of life. Guide their movies by consulting the Legion of Decency.

VII—Reading—Censor their reading especially the Comics so-called. Teach them to read and remain interested in good reading.

VIII—Modesty in Dress—Don't be influenced by the pagan immorality in dress that is shamelessly parading in public today.

IX—Keeping Busy—Idleness is the devil's workshop. Work along with play should be developed in every child by his parents.

X—Soldier of Christ—As soldiers of Christ, loyalty to Christ their King and to His Kingdom in everything will be inculcated at every opportunity by loyal parents.

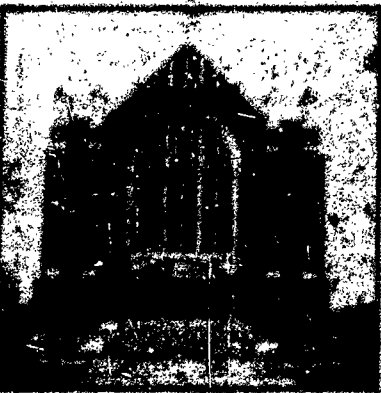

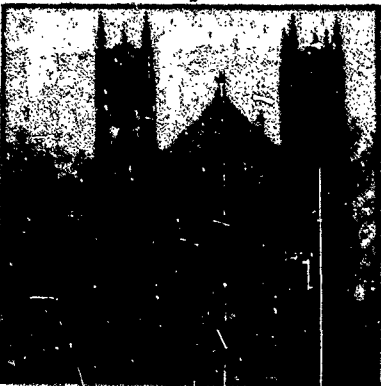
