According To The Doctor

We seldem hear of a child dying of tuberculosis, but that is no criterion as to the ease with which he may become infected, says the Wisconsia. Anti-Tuberculosis Association. Tuberculosis behaves like two separate discesses. The first time the gaysa gets into the body, usually from a person with an active case, the infection frequently runs a fairly harmless course. The child, may never be conscious of baving any illness and apparently complete healing occurs in over 10 per cent of the cases. We seldem hear of a celle dying

That bealing, however, is not as complete as it mems. Under a va-riety of circumstances, a break-ing down of the old spot may oc-cur and this time the second in-fection, the adult form, is far from harmless, This breaking down, however, cannot occur unless a person already has had the first

The tuberculin test will detect simply and harmlessly if the child has any infection. If the result is positive, as X-ray of the chest becomes necessary to determine the type and extent of the trouble. Children who react to the tuberculin should be given periodic X-rays, even though the first revesled no luberculoris. Those who were negative should be given tuberculin tests with each physical examination.

In each case of reaction to tu berculin a thorough theckup is advisable to determine the cause of the infection. Sometimes it is a parent, a relative, a domestic or even a school teacher who may have been the nource of the pri-mary infection. And that same individual, if the contact is not broken, may be the cause of the second infection.

Where the second infection is attributable to a breakdown, rather than to a repealed contact with the tuberculous, we may tisually look for inadequate dist or over-exertion as the malfactors. Sometimes. however, a non-tuberculous infec-tion such an mension of severe sore throat may be the onuse.
