BUENOS AIRES — The Metropolitan Cathedral is among the structures in the Capital which have just been decreed "historic monuments."

Nazi 'Kindness' Pure Sham

NEW YORK — The Nazis used apparent kindness and respect in the first few days of their occupation of Belgium in an evident attempt to win good will, but within a few weeks this turned out to be "pure sham," according to a report from a Belgian letter from a priest in Belgium, excerpts of which have just been published here.

The letter is one of several of this kind, of which excerpts have been published by the Belgium Information Center here in a booklet entitled "We Suffer in a Thousand Ways."

"All Catholic social workers have been suppressed" in Belgium, the priest wrote. "The same applies to Catholic trade unions, syndicates, etc. All these groups have been annihilated; and all our former activities are handed over to the State."

"Priests are forbidden" he continued, "to take an interest in culture; in other words, all activities which are not of a purely religious nature may not be attended by them. One must pray. It is not clear that the future of Belgium depends on the outcome of this war."

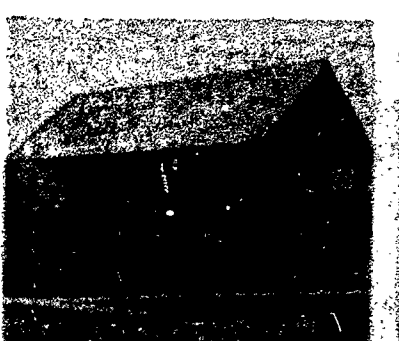
