You are going to take your place in that army massed for the protection of that freedom.

History of Service

"Be earnest in your endeavor to equip yourself to give the highest service and be eager to serve and to do for your country. This spirit was exemplified in the article published in the newspaper of a young man from this part of the State who enlisted in the Marines. He was a college boy—twenty years old.

"His superior officers felt that the completion of his college course would develop in him greater talents for leadership in the branch of the service to which he had been accepted and they insisted that he finish his college course. He accepted this decision but was disappointed. Six weeks remained before the beginning of his summer course at college. He could have spent that time in idle dalliance before the opening of school. But he had six weeks and during those six weeks he wanted to do something for his country.

"He went down to the docks of Jersey City and secured a place on a tanker about to make a trip to the Caribbean Sea. He was assigned work in the hold. It was hard, ports were closed and soiled most of the time, the heat was almost

Vacation Hints

With rationing of gas shortage of tires, reduction of railroad travel it looks as if many people will spend their vacations at home this summer. Nevertheless, here are a few simple rules to remember if you start on your vacation, or a weekend, or an outing.

- 1. If driving keep under 30 miles an hour. It saves gas and rubber. These are vital war materials.
2. Complete all details early and obtain plenty of rest the night before leaving.
3. Swim and dive only in safe waters and always with someone else. Wait at least two hours after eating before going into the water.
4. Take your sun baths gradually, until your skin gets used to the sun. Remember, the safe tolerance to exposure to the sun is not the same for all individuals.
5. Exercise moderately, dress lightly, and eat wisely.
6. Boil water, if it is not known to be absolutely pure, before drinking it.
7. Learn to recognize poison ivy, poison sumac, avoid them. After exposure to either wash thoroughly with strong soap and water.

You go forth therefore trusting in God, ready and eager to serve Him, to give your best that America may live and that freedom may not perish from the earth."
