"To transform courageous Christians into criminals, the first steps have already been taken. Since February (1941) a special police force, attached to the Secretarial of information, has been engaged in surveillance of the mentality. Mail censorship and telephone survoillance make possible the proparution of dossiers. The regimen of secret denunciation has been instituted and functions in the street and even within the family, as it does in Nasi Germany itself! In schools and colleges, cells of the National Revolutionary Youth de-nounce fellow-students and profes-sors. In some instances the Legion hus been debased by the use of its members for an identical purpose. On all sides, the press has begun publishing wannings such as the one that appeared in Gringoire on June 27 (1941).




