NETHERLANDS OFFICIAL, NOW IN U. S., IS CATHOLIC LEADER

NEW YORK.—Peter Kerstens, Netherlands Minister of Economic Affairs who is now visiting the United States, was at one time President of the Catholic Indian Party in the Netherlands East Indies. A prominent writer and member of Catholic Action, he is an ad-

mirer of the late G. K. Chesterton and translated Chesterton's "Orthodoxy" into Dutch.

As head of the Netherlands Merchant Marine, which now owns and operates all Dutch ships, Mr. Kerstens has accomplished much for the protection of seamen who may become incapacitated in the course of their dangerous work and has taken steps to maintain proper conditions of employment for them.

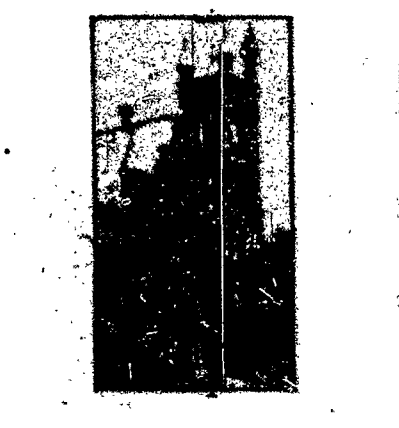
