

Army Calls Fr. Kuhn, Redemptorist Of St. Joseph's Church

Second of the Redemptorist Fathers of St. Joseph's Church to enter the U. S. Army, the Rev. Gerard J. Kuhn, C.S.S.R. was commissioned a First Lieutenant (Chaplain) and on July 2 received his appointment to Camp Thomas at Newport, Kentucky.

First of the Redemptorist Fathers from St. Joseph's Church here was the Rev. John Brennan, C.S.S.R., who is now stationed at Pearl Harbor. Father Kuhn is the 62nd Redemptorist of the Baltimore Province to give his services for the spiritual comfort of our boys in the Army and Navy.

Born in Erie, Pa., Father Kuhn was ordained to the Holy Priesthood in the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer at the Redemptorist Seminary, Esopus, N. Y., in 1933. In 1935 he was assigned to Rochester.

During the past seven and a half years, Father Kuhn has labored at St. Joseph's Church, Rochester. During those fruitful years of apostolic effort he has endeared himself to countless souls.

He will be remembered for his conducting of the Devotions to Our Mother of Perpetual Help on Wednesdays and for his zealous assistance in the work for the Catholic Deaf.

NEW YORK.—A campaign to force Christians to declare invalid the baptism of persons of Jewish birth has been inaugurated by the Nazis in Czechoslovakia, according to the Czecho-Slovak Press Bureau here.

Quoting the German-controlled Caske Slava, the bureau said the Aryan Society in the "Protectorate" has started the action, which is said to demand also purging the Old Testament "of everything smuggled in by rabbi interpreters."

B. E. Finucane Heads Area Victory Bond Group

Launching the first meeting of its Committeemen, the United States Treasury, Victory Fund Committee, Region 2 of New York State, met Monday night in Rochester. The meeting was presided over by Bernard E. Finucane, President of Security Trust Company of Rochester, its Chairman.

The purpose of the United States Treasury Victory Fund Committee is the distribution of United States Government bonds through normal investment channels. The organization is a voluntary one and the committee and associates through the country will devote their energies principally to the sale of new Treasury issues such as bills, Certificates of Indebtedness, notes "Tap" issue and regular market offerings of bonds, and to cooperate with the War Savings Staff in the sale of Series F and G War Bonds.

The National Victory Fund Committee consists of the Secretary of the Treasury as Chairman, and the Presidents of the twelve Federal Reserve Banks. In each Federal Reserve District a district Victory Fund Committee has been organized with the President of the Federal Reserve Bank of the District as Chairman. An Executive Manager has been appointed by each district committee and he is the chief executive officer of the committee.

The Second Federal Reserve District is divided into fifteen Regions, each under a Regional Chairman. Mr. Finucane is the Chairman of Region "2" comprising the counties of Monroe, Livingston, Ontario, Seneca, Wayne and Yates.

Mr. Finucane outlined in general the proposed set-up to effectively assist the distribution of United States Government bonds. It is planned that each Committeeman will select captains for his own particular territory under his jurisdiction, who will in turn recommend the individuals who may be well qualified to contact the public in this important work.

Mr. Finucane stressed not only the important nature of this work, but also that the Victory Fund Committee is to be maintained as a permanent organization for the duration, and all its plans will be laid accordingly.

The Committeemen for Region "2" consists of the following: Robert C. Tait, Vice-President of the Genesee Valley Trust Company, Rochester, for Monroe County; James E. Welch, Vice-President of Genesee Valley National Bank & Trust Co., Genesee, for Livingston County; John D. Hamilton, President of Ontario County Trust Co., Canandaigua, for Ontario County; Thomas P. Bevins, President, Seneca County Trust Co., Seneca Falls, for Seneca County; John W. Hickey, Cashier of State Bank of Ontario, Ontario, for Wayne County; H. M. Putnam, President, Citizens Bank of Penn Yan, for Yates County.

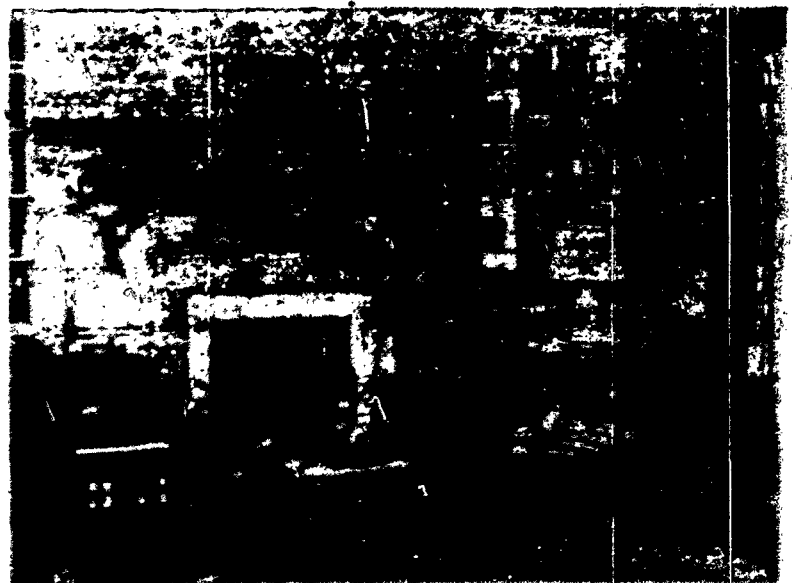
