Aerial Act Next At Roseland Park

One of the most unusual aerial riggings used by daredevil stars is employed by the Deteros Sensation who will appear at Roseland Park, Canandaigua Lake, from July 27 to Aug. 2, inclusive. TOWERING many feet in the air it supports two miniature airplanes which revolve constantly during the presentation of the act.

Suspended from the planes are trapezes which sway back and forth as the circular motion of the apparatus gains momentum. This provides a hazardous perch for the Deteros who go through a thrilling series of gymnastic and acrobatic routines, while suspended from the trapezes by their hands, feet or teeth.

Two girls and a man comprise the personnel and all are equally expert in aerial daredevilry, alternately performing on the trappings hanging from the air lanes or on a free-hanging ladder that is suspended from the middle of the rigging.

The Deteros have appeared at most of the well known outdoor events in this country and Canada and have long been recognized as one of the foremost thrill troupes in the world.

'Quiz' Corner

What is the meaning of a Plenary Indulgence?

A Plenary Indulgence is the remission by the Church of all the temporal punishment due sin. It is valid before God because Christ gave this authority to His Church as is shown in the Gospel of St. Matthew. It is not the pardon of

United States or the Governor of any one of the States to grant it. A Plenary Indulgence can be gained only by acts in the state of grace in virtue of the application of the supernatural merits of Christ and His saints in all of the communion of saints. The power to grant indulgences is very much like the power which every state exercises for the common good of society. The President of the United States or the Governor of a state has the right to grant a

plenary pardon to criminals who have been sentenced by law. Just as the state possesses the right to condemn or pardon the criminal and to regulate the punishment due his crime, so has the Church of Christ the divine right to pardon sin or to retain it, to remit either in whole or in part the punishment due to sin.

Little things done with a big heart go a great way with God.
