Hospital Closing Seen Political Maneuver

NEW ORLEANS — "Political maneuverings and machinations" were charged by the Most Rev. Jules B. Jeanmard, Bishop of Lafayette, in connection with the threatened closing of the New Orleans Charity Hospital, a State institution. There is also a State charity hospital in Lafayette.

A statement reminding public authorities of their duties for general welfare was adopted at the quarterly meeting held by New Orleans members of the St. Vincent de Paul Society on the feast of its patron.

Denouncing "professional officeholders" as "men who set their personal interests and ambitions above the public welfare which they have sworn to serve," Bishop Jeanmard said:

"The institutions of the State hospitals, insane asylums, penitentiary, schools, are regarded by them as so many political pawns and their personnel shifted about with every change of administration, regardless of the dislocation, confusion and human distress that result, so long as their selfish political purposes are served.

"They have written another shameful and infamous page in the history of our state which, through their political maneuverings and machinations, now has acquired the sorry distinction of being the first state of the Union to renege its sacred duty to its sick and poor.

Stamps Issued By Polish Government In London Show Cities In Ruins

LONDON.—(AP) — Eight postage stamps have been issued by the Polish Government in London. They will interest collectors but they have a limited usefulness. The stamps, which illustrate war subjects, will be used from Polish ships at sea, and Polish troops in Britain will be given an opportunity of sending their mail via Polish ships.

In design and color they resemble earlier Polish issues. They show airplanes, tanks, machine-guns and war planes in Polish cities. One stamp has a view of stricken Warsaw seen through charred beams of a bombed building, with St. John's Cathedral in the background. The entire design is surrounded by the Virtuti Cross which was awarded to the city for its heroic resistance.
