Word 'Missioner' Assumes New Meaning for American Forces Stationed Abroad

There are no more versatile people in the world than the missionaries of the Catholic Church. Their training, the divine charity which made possible their entrance into this world have all been contributing factors, while their daily contacts with strange and distant peoples have given them an unusual understanding and tolerance. These are known and conceded facts. However, unless one is personally acquainted with a missionary he is apt to feel that he has no personal relationship to himself.

Things have changed the past few months. Since the fateful December 7, 1941, a steady stream of soldiers, sailors, airmen and aviators have been leaving the shores of America. Thousands of this vast army were Roman Catholics—Catholics who had never left the great cities in which they were born—Catholics who had never traveled beyond the county in which their farms were located. They left the familiar things, the loved things to venture into the unknown. But when they reached the port of their future activities they found that they were not the only pioneers. A small but valiant army had preceded them—had "dug in" for winter and summer maneuvers, and for no other purpose than the salvation of the remote peoples who today are seeing and getting to know our own American troops. In some places our boys found that their predecessors were from the United States; in others that they were from allied or "enemy" nations. However there were no difficulties, since orders were always given by the same Commander-in-Chief, Jesus Christ Himself, and they

were for one purpose only—the salvation of souls. Unforgettable Experiences

For such of our American troops the term "missionary" assumes new significance. This is the one individual who brings them a bit of home, "a little bit of heaven." Only the men who are separated from their loved ones by thousands of miles, who must constantly endure heartbreaking discomfort and face ever-present death can appreciate what the presence of a Catholic missionary may mean. 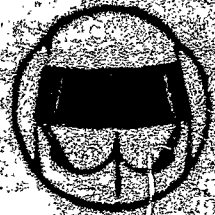

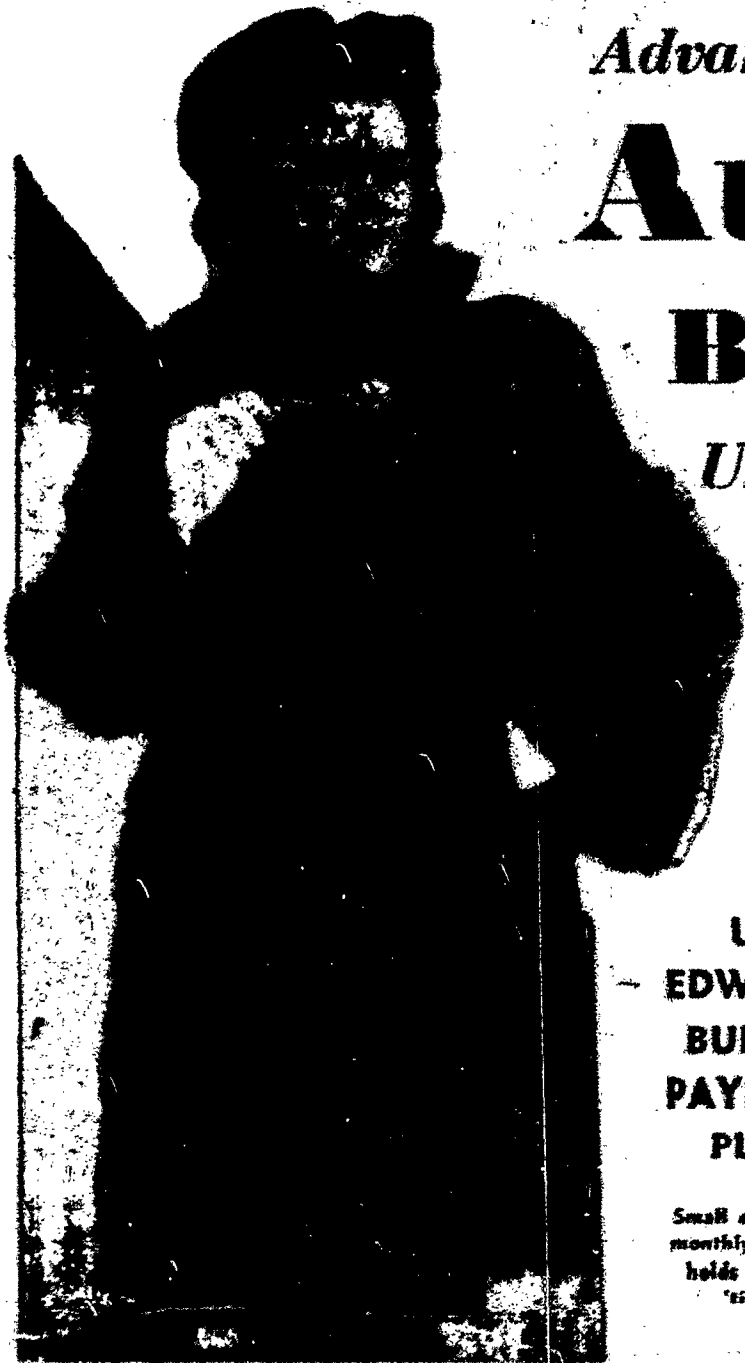
