On that Feast of St. Anne I offered my Mass for the welfare of all who prayed for me on that day. Of course, I included myself in the goodly company!

Of all the letters received one touched a cord that reverberated in a special manner. If I single that letter out for special mention I am sure no other correspondent will be moved to jealousy. It was from an old lady whom I have seen but twice in 34 years; once when she came to me in Rochester after one of my operations, and another time when she journeyed to Elmira on hearing that I arrived there with a broken leg. Now she reads the COURIER of my Jubilee, rushed to the bookstore for their latest Jubilee card, enclosed it with a letter in a Special Delivery. It reached me on the eve of St. Anne. Others will forget small favors, the poor never!

I have called her an old lady and such she must be now. But she was young when I knew her. In this same issue of the CATHOLIC COURIER, Father Lord devotes his column to a eulogy of waiters. When we opened St. Bernard's 49 years ago, the waitress at the Bishop's table was a young woman from Pennsylvania (we called it the Bishop's table, because the Bishop himself was Rector and had his meals there when he was in town), one of those old-time Catholic girls, clean, neat, courteous, decently dressed, but whose very gait and manner gave notice to all concerned that she knew her own place and that they should keep theirs. Such was Sarah Sullivan who sent me felicitations and promises of her prayers last Saturday.

Yes, Sarah, your letter touched me deeply and I thank you from the bottom of my heart. Only three of the dozen happy priests whom you served at "the Bishop's table" survive, and even the three are scattered far apart; but living or dead, I believe they all have kept a memory of your fine saintly example. May we all meet again at the Eternal Banquet from which there will be no parting.
