suppose that the Brooklyn Private, S. Van Dover, will ever forget his experience "Somewhere in Africa." As he wrote to his pastor he realized from actual experience that "ours is a truly universal Church that the work of Christ is going on throughout the entire world and that our Church in the U.S.A. is doing a major share in propagating our faith."

We all know and appreciate the remarkable work being done by the Catholic chaplains with the armed forces. There is the constant service in every branch of the army, the navy and aviation. But where American troops are garrisoned in mission lands they are learning first hand what our priests, Brothers and Sisters, have been and are doing. A real course in missiology is being conducted in addition to the perusal of the manual of arms.

The Rev. Daniel Watson S.M.S., missionary in Nigeria, has just returned to the American headquarters of his Society at Silver Spring, Maryland. He points out that Pan-American Airways in its ferrying service opens new fields for mission endeavor in Africa, while in the jungles the mission stations serve as social centers for American boys. The hostel established for this purpose by Father Jerry Philipps, S.M.A. in Lagos, the Nigerian capital, deserves special mention according to Father Watson. In addition a number of African missionaries are army chaplains in the allied forces and camp services have been included in the regular activities of missions in districts near the war zones.

While the so-called pagan peoples may be inclined to question the right of Christian peoples to war one upon another they cannot help but appreciate the aid being rendered by the priests, Brothers and Sisters who have remained at their posts regardless of bombardment and invasion. To quote the words of the Indian Bishop, the Most Rev. Francis Roche of Tutu-cora: "The present titanic war is an eye-opener to non-Catholics and pagans alike. They have been forced, however unwillingly to admire the sublime doctrine of our teachings and they have the highest praises for our missionaries. Thousands are making their peace with God, which they would not do but for this war, so we must conclude that the present Armageddon is not an unmixed evil."

The hardships which are being endured by our boys in the A.E.F. are many and trying, but with their baptism of fire has come a real knowledge and appreciative understanding of the work of the missionaries of the Catholic Church.

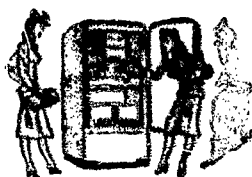

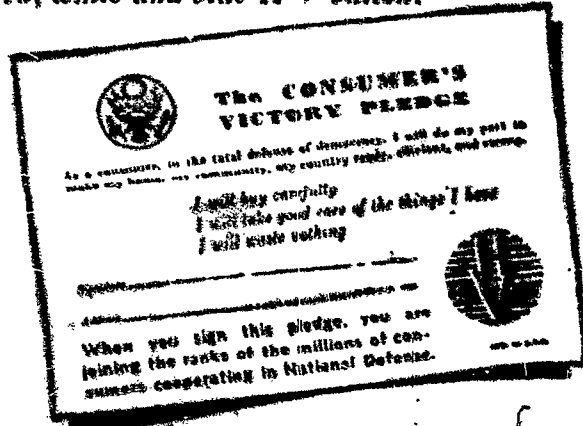
