He is a graduate of Churchville High School, St. Andrew's Seminary and St. Bernard's Seminary. Father Waterstraat is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Waterstraat of Mendon with whom he is spending a few days before his departure for his duties as Chaplain. He is one of six children and has a brother in the armed forces.

PATRONSAL PRAYER

The Feast of St. Alphonsus, patron saint of the parish, was observed Sunday with a solemn High Mass. St. Alphonsus was born of a Noble Neapolitan family on September 25, 1763 near Naples. The boy was given every advantage and was only sixteen years old when he received his degree of doctor of law. Shortly after he began practicing law, he made a serious mistake, which led him to think of a vocation to the priesthood for he realized the vanity of earthly fame. At the age of thirty he was ordained a priest and devoted himself to the poor and neglected. He founded the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer in order that the poor in remote parishes might be given spiritual care. St. Alphonsus vowed never to waste time and many of his books were written in the midst of bodily and mental suffering. St. Alphonsus died on August 1, 1787, was canonized in 1839 and Pope Pius X declared him a Doctor of the Church in 1871.

BOGOTA, Colombia.—An image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus was enthroned with solemn ceremonies in the editorial office of La Patria, Monday daily. Dr. Joaquin Betrande Manrique, one of the editors, spoke on the "Divine Personality of Jesus." "Above all," he said, "Christ is Peace—the Prince of Peace. Men react to the word only when they have forgotten His mandate and have abandoned His laws. There is no dispute among men or nations that could not be settled peacefully by following the ways of His doctrine and the indications of His truth."

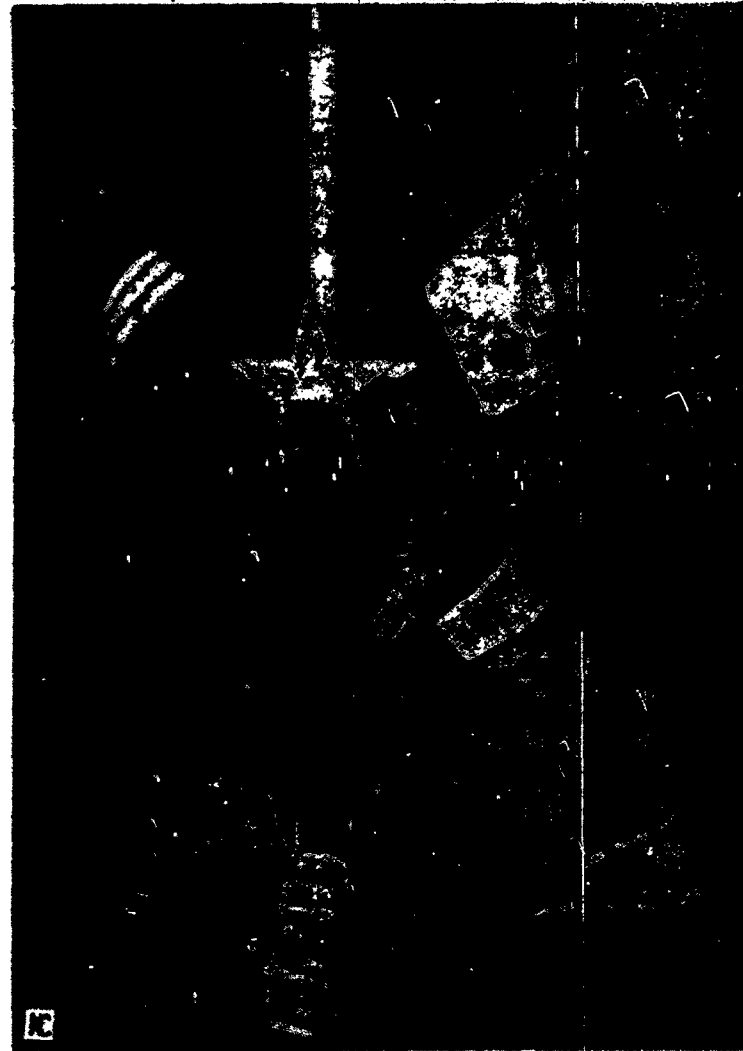
