The importance of the Four Freedoms is underlined again this week in the anniversary of the signing of the Atlantic Charter, based on our "Four Freedoms" ideal. by President Roosevelt and Prime Minister Churchill in an ocean rendezvous one year ago. To make clear the goals of the United Nations, the Office of War Information has just issued a 16page pamphlet; it should be "must" reading for every American who wants to understand what we are fighting for. In an introduction to the pamphlet, President Roosevelt wrote:

"The belief in the Four Freedoms of common humanity-the belief in man, created free, in the image of God-is the crucial difference between ourselves and the enemies we face today. In it lies the absolute unity of our alliance, opposed to the oneness of the evil we hate. Here is our strength, the source and promise of victory."
