# Papers State Nazi Tactics Divide France

(This is one of a series of articles based upon remarkable documents which have come out of Fennes and ore now in the pussession of the VOWO News Service, These purephiete and tenfiate, secretly circulate ed, make known to Frewheren the enormity of the offenses committed by the Nacl invaders).

Nazi tactics are bearing fruits of division in Christian France, the first issue of Califers du Termeigcase Chretien declared in its discussion of the "destruction" phase of the Axia program as applied in France. Every voice that dares to lenounce the equivocation of relfaboration with the New Order 3 gagged or choked, every apostulic activity that might obstruct the development of activities napired by Neal mysticism finds Itself in a strait pocket," the document m-forms the otherwise unenlightened or unwair French.
