AUBURN.—St. Mary's will observe the Feast Day with a Triduum beginning on Thursday evening at 7:30. There will be services on Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings at 7:30. They will consist of special prayers, a sermon by Father Luke Missett of the Passionist Congregation, and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. There will be Masses on Friday morning at 6, 7 and 8:30 o'clock and on Saturday morning at 6:15, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 12:15 o'clock. Confessions will be heard on Thursday evening after the devotion, on Friday afternoon and evening and on Saturday afternoon and evening. The Triduum will come to a close on Sunday morning with general Communion. Father Missett will preach at all the Masses on Sunday and the 11:30 o'clock Mass will be a Solemn High Mass in honor of Our Lady.

Saturday, being the Feast of the Assumption is a holyday of obligation. The Masses will be said at 5:15, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 12:15 o'clock. The 9 o'clock Mass will be a High Mass.

Friday will be a day of fasting and of abstinence, it being the

vigil of the Feast of the Assumption.
