VEND To Open New Classes For War Work Training

Vocational Education for National Defense officials have mapped a fall and winter program operative Sept. 8, Verne A. Bird, Assistant Superintendent of Schools and VEND Director, announced.

He said that new classes and courses will be scheduled to meet the training needs of thousands of men and women of all walks of life who are interested in training for the all out war effort, filling war jobs wherever needed.

Hundreds of young men have completed training from the VEND Aviation Ground School at Franklin High, according to a report released by Verne A. Bird, VEND War Industries training director.

Mr. Bird explained that a high percentage of trainees have been placed in important war plant jobs after completing the specified number of training hours required for recommendations to a war job.

The VEND airplane study includes fabric work, metal work, propellers, instruments, accessories, general assembly, rigging, alignment, service, maintenance, major overhaul, timing, tuneup, carburetors, magnetos, inspection and trouble shooting.

Another important phase of the course is the study of identification of Axis as well as Allied planes, learning the various types. Radio is also studied in relation to aviation as well as theory of flight and theory of engines.

VEND officials explained that practically every phase of ground school construction is taught trainees. The trainees who complete these courses can apply their training either with the armed forces or in aviation war plants.

Co-operation of government agencies and industry has placed 43 physically handicapped men and

women in war plant jobs since the beginning of the year, Verne A. Bird, local VEND War Industries Director, announced. After completing courses in the VEND program, 25 men and 8 women hindered such disabilities as amputated hands and feet, partial deafness, disabled arms and backs and missing fingers, and landed jobs.

The training and placement was undertaken by the Vocational Rehabilitation Bureau of the State Education Department, the VEND, and the United States Employment Service. Leslie Wood, District Supervisor of the Bureau of Vocational Rehabilitation, directed the organization of training and placement with Douglas Petrie, Junior Counselor for the handicapped of the United States Employment Service.

Mr. Wood pointed out that physically handicapped persons may apply for rehabilitation and training at the Rehabilitation Office in the Terminal Building.

The parachute making training class under VEND at Vocational High School has completed its first week with 176 registrations. This is a capacity for the school and according to VEND Director Verne A. Bird, more classes will be started at other schools to absorb the heavy load of registrants. These new courses will start Sept. 8.


