'American-Lithuanian Day'
August 23rd for the members of St. George's parish will mean the occasion for recalling to mind the preciousness of our God-given rights. This will be the 'American-Lithuanian Day' when the program of the day's celebration will remind the parishioners of the horrible destruction and devastation of their former fatherland, Lithuania, due to the unnatural

state of war. Whereas the security of the present time is guaranteed here in the United States only in so far as each individual assumes personally his part in the war effort. That will be the theme of this day's doings.

Because of the patriotic tradition to conserve when necessary, this year's American-Lithuanian Day will be celebrated on the parish grounds instead of the former practice of going outside the city limits. Here, at the hall, a dinner will be served from 12:30 P. M. to 2:30 P. M. After the dinner, the various undertakings planned by the parish committee headed by the Rev. John Baksys will take place.

During the entire day there will be opportunities for dancing either to the Lithuanian folk music or the music of the American youth. Also taking part in these festivities will be prominent Lithuanians from Buffalo and Niagara Falls as well as those from this vicinity.


