Poorest Singers Among Soldiers Most Enjoy Community Singing

WASHINGTON. "It's the poorest singers among the soldiers who enjoy community singing most," according to Pat Galtner, Field Program Consultant for the National Catholic Community Service. Mr. Galtner, former member of the St. Louis University faculty and director of music there for sixteen years, has completed a last tour of USO clubs operated by the NCCS in southern States, during which he conducted experiments in community singing.

"This form of group entertainment is proving very popular with the men in USO clubs," said Mr. Galtner.

Many clubs have instituted community singing as a regular part of the weekly program. The Capitol City Music Study Club of Olympia, Wash., sponsored a revival of the old-fashioned community sing at the local USO club, and similar performances have been held at Alexandria and New Orleans, La.

Cardinal Calls For National Prayer Days

LONDON. Responding to a desire expressed by King George that the third anniversary of the war, which occurs on Sept. 3, be observed as a national day of prayer. His Eminence Arthur Cardinal Hinsley Archbishop of Westminster, has issued a statement in behalf of the Hierarchy appointing Sept. 3 and the following Sunday, Sept. 8 as days of prayer.

"The issues at stake are so momentous and the result of the conflict so poised in the balance," His Eminence said, "that we ought to redouble our prayers and sacrifices to obtain from Almighty God the strength which He alone can give."
