## 93 PRIESTS, SEMINARIANS GIVE BLOOD TO RED CROSS

COONONGOWOC, Wis. - The blood of 93 priests and seminarians at the Redemptorist Seminary here, has gone into the plasma bank of the American Red Cross and will eventually find its way into the veins of American soldiers, sailors

and marines who may be wounded in action.

Desiring to have a part in America's war effort, the authorities at the Redemptorist Seminary of Coonongowoc requested the Milwaukee Chapter of the American Red Cross to send a mobile unit to the seminary. A bleeding center was established in the visitors' parlor and in one afternoon all 93 donors did their bit for the boys in service.

When the job was completed

there was the immediate assurance that the donors had given the opportunity to give again. According to Red Cross regulations, at least one more must give before they will be possible.

## Priest Outlines Fire Bomb Fighting For Red Cross Unit

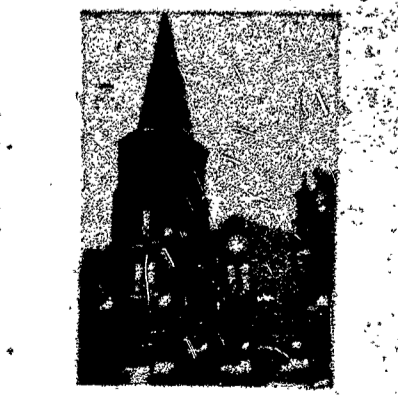
