tion that the influence of the Sodality was not only nationwide but world wide in its scope and that the influence of the Sodality work reached far beyond their imagination.

A few years ago the Queen's Work, the official organ of the Sodality published the following account of a young woman's feeling concerning the first convention of the Sodality which was held in 1928. "Some of the Sodalists weren't sure they wanted to go, but they put on their hats, set their teeth and accepted what they regarded as their fate. But during those days of 1928 we had a breathlessly good time, met the most delightful people, from Boston, San Francisco and New Orleans and established friendships which have withstood time and distance. But our pleasures were not by any means essentials. For we discovered that some of those delightful people did want to go, that they had already applied a modern interpretation of the original purposes of the Sodality and we went back home and had the enormous privilege of helping to convince frivolous and rather sophisticated young men and women that they did want to."

### Topics Listed
