Women In War Effort
Aid Red Cross
Home Nursing
Tutor Project

The National Council of Catholic Women and the National Council of Catholic Nurses are lending "all out" collaboration to a home-nursing project inaugurated by the American Red Cross. It was revealed in Washington today.

The disclosure came in connection with a visit by this city of Miss Mary Kelly, of Detroit, President of the National Council of Catholic Nurses, and her conference with Miss Margaret T. Lynch, Executive Secretary of the N. C. C. W., and with Red Cross officials.

The Red Cross program, which seeks the fullest utilization and conservation of the nation's nursing and hospital facilities, calls for the training of at least one person in each family to give a minimum of nursing care to that family. In this way, the trained member of the family can give aid in an emergency, and can care for persons who are chronically ill, or not seriously ill, and who may not be able to find hospital accommodations at a given time, particularly in serious emergencies.

The National Council of Catholic Nurses is preparing to lend maximum cooperation in the training of instructors for home nursing and the National Council of Catholic Women, through its affiliated councils, will seek to enlist candidates for such courses.

Division of NCCS
Opens St. Louis Club

The USO Club operated by the National Catholic Community Service was formally dedicated here in St. Louis by the Most Rev. John J. Glennon, Archbishop of St. Louis. Miss Anne Sarachon Hooley, Assistant Director of the NCCS, spoke.

Outlining the need for an adequately equipped place for the women and girls who have left their homes to aid the war effort, Archbishop Glennon said: "We are dedicating this new house for the woman who is in the war production plants here. This is a house where she can come after a day of hard work is done. This is a place where she can rest, relax and find recreation."

Speaking on the importance of the work of women in the war effort, Miss Hooley said: "It has been remarked by a Government official that when we provide recreation for the man in uniform we have done only part of the job until we care for the girl with whom he associates in these crowded areas. The service here, however, is to a greater extent for the girl in the war production plant. Her morale is important, too, because the equipment which she handles may mean life or death, success or victory to the man in uniform. Moreover, she is the homemaker of tomorrow."

NCCS Joins In Plans
For New WAAC Club

The USO, through the National Catholic Community Service, the Young Women's Christian Association and the Jewish Welfare Board, is opening a club for the trainees of the Women's Auxiliary Army Corps. This new activity is situated near historic Fort Des Moines, Iowa. The program arranged follows closely the activities planned for the men of the armed forces.

Conferences regarding the recreation for the WAAC's emphasized that since the women will train and serve under the same conditions as men of the army, then their off-duty problems will be very similar. Dances, recreational facilities such as indoor games, a reading room provided with the latest books and magazines, writing materials, and opportunity to indulge in the following of any hobbies they may have enjoyed in private life will be provided.
