## Postulant Receives Habit At Winton Road Monastery

With its impressive and colorful ritual, the ceremony of the Reception of the Habit was carried out at the Monastery of the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity of the Refuge, Winton Road North on Wednesday, August 18. On this day, the feast-day of the founder of the Congregation, St. John Eudes, our postulant, Miss Elizabeth Gocher, of Holy Apostles parish, received the religious habit. She will be known in religion as Sister Mary of our Lady of Charity.

In charge of the ceremony, as delegate of the Most Reverend Bishop was the Rev. Francis B. Burns, of St. Bernard's Seminary. He was assisted by the Rev. Wilfred Kehoe S.S.E. The high Mass was celebrated by the Rev. George V. Fredmore, with the girls of Holy Angels School singing the parts of the Mass. The sermon was preached by the Rev. William Dugan, C. S. B. Present in the sanctuary were the Reverend Fathers: Leo V. Smith, John M. Duffy, William Ayres, Robert Fennerty, and Charles Boyle. Mr. Raymond Moore, a student at St. Bernard's Seminary served the officers at the ceremony. The little chapel was

filled with friends and relatives of the young postulant and representatives of various religious orders of the city were also present. In the afternoon a service consisting of rosary, sermon and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament brought to a close this happy day for the new novice.

The Monastery of the Congregation of the Sisters of our Lady of Charity of the Refuge was founded in Rochester in 1893, by the Monastery on West St., in Buffalo, the mother house of the Congregation in North America, under the patronage of the late Bishop John Francis O'Hern. The Rochester Monastery is now autonomous and is headed by Mother St. Joseph Maria who was chosen superior at the canonical election, held in May of this year. The novitiate is an integral part of the canonical set-up of the Monastery, in which young women possessing the necessary prerequisites will be admitted in the future.

When they began their work in the diocese of Buffalo, the Sisters were called the Sisters of the Good Shepherd, to avoid confusion because of the presence of the Sisters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul who were already laboring in the diocese. This title, however, is not accurate, as the Sisters of the Good Shepherd are a distinct religious order, founded by St. Euphrasia in the last century and consequently an offshoot of the original order founded by St. John Eudes in the 17th century.

The specific work of the Institute of Our Lady of Charity is the care of young women and girls, to help them meet the problems which they now face or will hereafter meet in the community, to the end that they may be enabled to lead a good Christian life and thus save their souls.

The Rochester Monastery conducts the Holy Angels Home in Winton Road North in the Town of Irondequoit, where girls of the "teen" age group are received. Here they are given protection and training for their future life in the community. Provision is made for the continuance of their formal education, thru a program of both primary and secondary education, under the supervision of both public and diocesan school boards. Training along other lines, especially in home-making and domestic science is also provided to fit them for their place in the community. The program of the Institution is under the supervision of the New York State Department of Social Welfare, and is also coordinated with the various welfare departments and diocesan charities of the various counties from which the girls come.

## Bishop Pontificates

VATICAN CITY.—The Most Rev. Edward Count O'Rourke, Titular Bishop of Sophene and former Bishop of Danzig, pontificated at the solemn Mass in the chapel of the Irish College of Rome in commemoration of the episcopal silver jubilee of His Holiness Pope Pius XII. Although born at Basin, in the Russian Diocese of Minsk, the retired Bishop is a descendant of Irish nobility.

## Villanova College Scholarship Goes To Aquinas Grad
